

Young Researcher International Training Program (ITP)
“On-site Education of Practical Languages for Area Studies”

ITP Office

The Graduate School of Asian and African Area Studies, jointly with the Center for Southeast Asian Studies, and under the Young Researcher International Training Program (ITP), sponsored by the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science, has implemented a “On-site Education of Practical Languages for Area Studies” program, one important pillar of which is support for language acquisition in overseas localities. Overseas dispatch is divided into two parts. With the cooperation of twelve overseas partner institutions, PhD program students, focusing on those who have still to write their pre-doctoral dissertation, will receive “input level” support for local language acquisition. Researchers who have completed their pre-doctoral dissertation, post doctoral students, and assistant professors, will receive “output level” support for the improvement of international communication capabilities.

Application for 2011 Academic Year will be scheduled to open May 30 (Mon) through 12 noon of June 03 (Fri), 2011.

1. Overseas Dispatch for the “Input Level” (Local Language Acquisition)

(1) Outline

Graduate students enrolled in the Graduate School of Asian and African Area Studies may be dispatched to one of ten partner institutions for periods of three months to six months. Financial assistance will be available for local language acquisition that is genuinely suited to Area Studies.

(2) Qualifications for Application

- Applicants should be graduate students enrolled at the Graduate School of Asian and African Area Studies,
- In principle, applicants should be students who have not yet submitted the pre-doctoral dissertation,
- DC (doctor) and PD (post-doctoral) researchers at the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science are not eligible for this program,
- Students on leave of absence are also not eligible for this program,
- A second application for this program will be accepted, but first-time students will be given priority.

(3) Number of students accepted

Approximately ten students

(4) Dispatch period

In principle, between three months and six months within the period of July 15, 2011 to March 15, 2012.

3. Language qualification examination fee* (both inside Japan and overseas).

*The latest examination before the dispatch, during the dispatch and within one year after the dispatch will be covered.

(8) Selection Criteria

The criteria for those who apply for the input level support are their creativity and experiences on language acquisition, their eagerness and seriousness for the research, and their capacity to plan attractive researches. The present level of the language trained in this program is not a significant criterion.

1. Reports

- (a) An English or Japanese (Please use the report form from the website.)
- (b) A version in the language of training (You are open to write any topics based on your research theme or language training etc. Please do not forget to attach the summary of this report in English or Japanese.)

2. Lexicon of technical terms in the trained language on your research topic (minimum 100words)

- (a) Translation of the words may be shown in any one of the following three formats; Japanese, English or French.
- (b) Recorded sound data files according to your lexicon

3. Photographs, video pictures etc.

4. Report at the next application briefing

5. Presentations at the International symposium

- Applicants should consult with their advising professors concerning the language training content and period of overseas dispatch.
- Please determine appropriate dispatch timing with reference to the details of the partner institutions (available on the website or from the coordinating professors).
- Students who are eligible to apply but who are receiving / will receive other research funds, particularly from “Fieldwork Internship/G-COE/Soshikiteki program” should pay attention to the followings;
 1. Fieldwork Internship/G-COE/Soshikiteki program’s recipients are eligible to apply, but they are required to clearly separate the travel itinerary into a Fieldwork Internship/G-COE/Soshikiteki program’s period and an ITP period.

2. Recipients of other funds have to seek the consultation with the ITP office in advance of sending an application.

2. Output Level (Improvement in International Communication Capabilities)

(1) Outline

Assistance will be extended to researchers who have completed the pre-doctoral dissertation, post-doctoral students and assistant professors in the Graduate School of Asian and African Area Studies or the Center for Southeast Asian Studies to visit the three overseas partner institutes to improve their international communication capabilities.

(2) Qualifications for Application

- Applicants should be researchers who have completed the pre-doctoral dissertation, post-doctoral students, or assistant professors in the Graduate School of Asian and African Area Studies or the Center for Southeast Asian Studies.
(Please ask the ITP office if you have any further questions.)
- DC (doctor) and PD (post-doctoral) researchers at the Japan Society for the Promotion of Science are not eligible for this program,
- Researchers on leave of absence are also not eligible for this program.

Approx. 2 researchers

Approximately three months within the period 15 July, 2011 to 15 March, 2012.

(8) Selection Criteria

The criteria for those who apply for the output level support are their prospects for improving the international communication capabilities* (e.g. the capabilities to have academic discussions in international conferences). The applicants are presupposed to have language abilities for the field-work.

*Those who are applying for UK or France, will be asked to hand in the result of recent language qualification examination.
