

### **ITP Partner Institution: Hasanuddin University (Website)**

Kyoto University Graduate School of Asia and Africa Area Studies (ASAFAS) and the Center for Southeast Asian Studies (CSEAS) concluded an Inter-Departmental Academic Exchange Agreement with Hasanuddin University Research Organization in 2001, but even before that time there was a long history of academic exchanges between CSEAS and Hasanuddin University (UNHAS). Since the 1970s, many academic studies of the ecology, culture and society of South Sulawesi, where Hasanuddin University is located, have been carried out, and the number of graduate students coming to study at Kyoto University has also increased greatly. A significant number of researchers have also visited CSEAS as international visiting scholars. This represents a significant exchange achievement between Kyoto University and Hasanuddin University that has continued up to the present.

Hasanuddin University is the largest general national university in eastern Indonesia. At present, as well as having 14 faculties and one graduate program, the university also hosts a large number of research centers. Makassar Field Station has been established in the research organization, jointly with the researchers in these faculties and research centers, and through the 21<sup>st</sup> Century COE Program. The Field Station is the home of a collection of literature, maps, and so on concerning Sulawesi, and is also utilized as a research base for Sulawesi area studies. The Field Station is at present a part of the ongoing Global COE Program and is also an education and research exchange base. With the cooperation of Hasanuddin University, the Field Station will continue to be used as a facility open to not only Japanese, but to all international researchers who come to Sulawesi.

In the ongoing ITP project, two master's students have already been dispatched to Hasanuddin University for language training. An advising

professor is assigned to each graduate student on the basis of research theme, and one-on-one Indonesian language training may be arranged through the University Language Center.
