Summary

This was presentation by Emily Mutotu-Outreach Manager, about the training, research

and community outreach programs and efforts at Gobabeb Training and Research Center. In an

effort to promote sustainable lifestyle in the Namib Desert, the contribution of the centre was crucial

since its establishment as a merger of Desert Research Foundation of Namibia and Ministry of

Environment and Tourism. Outdoor learning is the training philosophy where trainees enjoy the

exposure to direct arid land ecology and the opportunity to mix and interact with various researchers

visiting the center and working on a multitude of topics. The program activities include !Nara

production, Kuiseb basin management, and Namibia coast conservation and management.

According to Emily Mutotu, the community programs in the Centre include sustainable

agriculture, appropriate technology, tour guide training and livestock management. The outreach

program follows a two-way process where media, public open days, conference networking and

publication of findings on the program issues serve as a link to reach and raise awareness of

stakeholders. In an effort to diversify the livelihood options of the communities dwelling in the

Namib, the engagement in tourism business creates a demand supply chain in the tourism facilities to

be realized. It is thus expected to pay the community off a supportive option of advertizing its

culture, providing sustainable and fair income source from eco-tourism initiatives. Promising efforts
